Please send entry forms as early as possible to avoid last minute mail or fax problems. If you entered in 2009, you are on our mailing list. To change your address or be added to the list, email information to Jan@Deltafest.com or call (901) 487-3075. Our website, www.DeltaFest.com is available anytime.

2. All craft, collectible, photography and student art entries are to be brought to the Agricenter, Wing D **outside entrance**, 7777 Walnut Grove Rd, Memphis, on **Saturday, August 28, 2009**, from **9 am till 6 pm**. Entries will not be accepted before or after this time. Exhibitors may only enter one exhibit per class.
3. Entry tags will be supplied upon arrival at Wing D on Saturday. Tags must be securely attached to each Item submitted for competition. Volunteers will be available to assist with putting on tags.
4. Committee chairmen, volunteers and judges may not exhibit in any category they are contributing their volunteer services in. They may compete in other categories. Adult exhibitors are those who are 19 or older. Youth exhibitors are those who are 18 and younger. Decisions by the judges are final. No winners will be given over the telephone. Delta Fair opens at 2 pm, Friday, Sept 3, 2010 – come see if you won!
5. Items entered for competition must be the work of the exhibitor – unless noted as a group or club. All entries must never have been exhibited before at Delta Fair. Container grown plants may have been exhibited before. Soiled or stained articles will not be accepted. Chairmen and director reserve the right to accept or reject any entry, depending on condition and suitability of the exhibit.
6. Every effort to protect and care for your exhibit will be shown. However, Universal Fairs, ExpoSouth, Delta Fair & Music Festival, owners, directors, employees and volunteers in the Crafts, Culinary & Collectible area will not be responsible for any loss or damage to the entries. Security is provided in the display area during times the Fair is open to the public.
7. Exhibits will be displayed depending upon available space. Delta Fair reserves the right to only display ribbon winners. Quilt entries may be displayed on rods or in cases, again depending on space. Ribbons will be awarded as merit may warrant. Items must be individually worthy.
8. Entries may NOT be removed before Monday, September 13, 2010, from noon till 6 pm, at the **outside** entrance of Wing D, at the Agricenter. Exhibits not picked up on Monday, Sept. 13, will be donated to charity.
9. Premiums will be paid at pickup on Monday, September 13, 2010.

All entries are displayed in standard ring top jars with rings left on. Fill jars to the neck of the jar, allow ¼” headspace for jams, jellies and preserves. Allow ½” for pickles and fruit and 1” for vegetables. Any item that shows spoilage will be removed from the display.

HORTICULTURE—AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT GUIDELINES

DELTA FAIR MANAGEMENT welcomes competition in these shows by any non-professional grower or designer in the Delta area. All entries are open to the public.

THE FAIR HORTICULTURE COMMITTEE CONFORMS to the standards established by the National Garden Clubs, Inc.; and is therefore providing two (2) standard flower shows on the following pages sponsored by the Delta Fair and The Tennessee Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc. District I, and are offering one (1) or more of National Garden Club's top awards.

The purposes of a standard flower show are four-fold:

- A. To educate
- B. To stimulate interest in horticulture, agriculture and floral designs.
- C. To provide an outlet for creative expression
- D. To convey to the community the objectives of NGC, Inc.

ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE ENTERED on official Delta Fair Entry Forms. These forms and the Horticulture Schedule may be picked up at the Shelby County Extension Service office located in the B Wing at the Agricenter or downloaded from the Delta Fair website. **NO ADULT MAY ENTER IN THE YOUTH DIVISION AND NO YOUTH MAY ENTER IN THE ADULT SECTION WHERE SPECIFIED IN THE SCHEDULE.**

PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUESTED for all Adult Artistic Design classes, but registration will be accepted up to show day. Contact the Show Chairman or General Committee Chairman for entry information. An exhibitor tag, available at the Extension Service office in Wing B of the Agricenter, will be issued for each entry and must be securely affixed to the item. Exhibitors bringing more than ten (10) specimens are requested to obtain entry tags in advance. A Horticulture Exhibitor can enter **ONLY ONE ENTRY PER VARIETY** in each class. A Homegrown Vegetable/Fruit Exhibitor can enter **ONLY ONE ENTRY** in each class. Entry tags may be picked up at the Extension Service office in Wing B of the Agricenter between 9:00 am and 4:00 pm after August 16, 2010.

EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED to bring their exhibits and entry form to the entry desk outside the entrance to Wing D of the Agricenter. The entry sheet with exhibitor's name, address, telephone number and listed entries must be left with the entry clerks. **ALL YOUTH EXHIBITORS (under 18 years of age) MUST LIST THEIR AGE ON THE REGISTRATION FORM.**

TOP AWARDS AND PRIZES MUST BE BOTANICALLY NAMED ON THE ENTRY FORM AND ENTRY TAG, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF HOMEGROWN VEGETABLE/FRUIT ENTRIES.

NO EXHIBITOR WILL BE PERMITTED to remove any exhibit, or any part thereof, without permission FROM the Show Chairman or Director until the pick-up day. However, replacement of wilted/dead flowers in floral designs may be made by the exhibitor to maintain the quality of the show. Homegrown Vegetable/fruit and cut horticultural entries will not be returned.

ARTISTIC ENTRIES FOR YOUTH AND ADULTS MAY NOT HAVE BEEN PREVIOUSLY ENTERED AND JUDGED IN THE DELTA FAIR.

THE SHOW COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT to remove any and all exhibits or parts thereof if and when deterioration is noted or ineligibility is determined.

WHILE EVERY REASONABLE PRECAUTION WILL BE TAKEN for safeguarding exhibits, it is distinctly understood that in NO CASE shall the Delta Fair, its Directors, Officers, or Agents be held responsible for any loss, damage, or injury of any character to any person, animal or article while participating in the Fair.

THE FLOWER SHOW COMMITTEE WILL EXERCISE CARE, but the exhibitor agrees that the Committee is NOT responsible for loss, breakage, or damage to containers or accessories. Exhibitors are **REQUIRED** for identification to place their name on the bottom of containers and/or accessories left in the building.

EMPHASIS IS ON FRESH PLANT MATERIAL. Exhibitors must keep designs and horticulture fresh or provide materials for the Show Committee to do so. Some plant material must be used in every exhibit.

ALL SPECIMENS MUST BE GROWN BY THE EXHIBITOR. Container-grown plants **MUST** have been in the possession of the exhibitor at least **three (3) months**. Combination plantings and dish gardens **MUST** have been growing together and in the exhibitor's possession for at least **six (6) weeks** prior to exhibiting.

CONTAINERS FOR CUT SPECIMENS will be furnished by the Fair committee.

HORTICULTURE SPECIMENS CAN NOT BE TREATED with anything other than soap and water and should be well groomed and of show quality. No unattached foliage is allowed. **Foliage which will be beneath water level of exhibit bottle must be removed.**

NO ARTIFICIAL PLANT MATERIAL OF ANY KIND WILL BE ALLOWED IN ANY DIVISION OF A SHOW. Fresh plant material may **NOT** be treated in any manner. Dried plant material may be treated.

THE CLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO (1) disqualify entries which do not meet schedule requirements. If they cannot be made to meet requirements, they will be placed and marked "**NOT FOR COMPETITION**".

THE EXHIBITOR IS PERMITTED to use wedging material for support to prop specimen in upright manner. Exhibitor is to provide wedging material. Proper wedging material types: sprig of evergreen, plug of wood, clear plastic wrap, etc.

CONTAINER-GROWN PLANTS may be exhibited in either clean clay, glazed or plastic pots. Double potting is allowed. **SOIL MUST NOT BE COVERED** by moss, bark, marbles, pebbles, etc., with the exception of cacti and succulent dish gardens. Decorative pots may be used if they do not distract from the specimen. **Exhibitor MUST supply saucers.**

PLANT MATERIAL ON TENNESSEE'S CONSERVATION LIST may be used only if accompanied by a card listing the **BOTANICAL and COMMON NAME and** stating the plant material was grown by the exhibitor from seed, other method or it was established as a native wilding on the exhibitor's property.

THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND CONSERVATION list of rare and endangered plants cannot be exhibited. Contact the Division of Natural Heritage, Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation for inquiries.

RELIGIOUS SYMBOLS used must be displayed in a respectful manner and in accordance with local church policy.

AMERICAN FLAG and other national flags are not permitted.

UNWRAPPED PREPARED FOOD IS NOT ALLOWED.

LANDSCAPES OR SCENES are **NOT PERMITTED** in the Design Division.

ACCESSORY(IES) AND BASE(S) are allowed in all design classes.

PLANT MATERIAL need not have been grown by the exhibitor in all design classes.

CONTRIVED FLOWERS and/or plant forms constructed of recognizable plant materials are permitted in all design classes.

Exhibits will be judged on a point scoring system. Copies of the point scoring system are available at the entry desk.

PREMIUM PAYMENTS: The Judge's Book will be the final authority for the determination of winners and payment will be made in accordance with the exhibits named therein. Premiums will be paid in full according to the Premium List and paid on the pick-up date, Monday, September 13, noon to 6 pm.

JUDGING OF HORTICULTURE ENTRIES will be conducted by National Garden Club Accredited Flower Show Judges, Student Judges, or recognized plant authorities in accordance with the rules of the National Garden Clubs, Inc., (NGC), for Standard Flower Shows as determined by the *Handbook for Flower Shows, 2007 Edition* and revisions as published in *The National Gardener*. Farm and Garden/Orchard produce entries will be judged by recognized authorities. Only authorized personnel will be allowed in the judging area during the judging period. Judges may withhold an award for any entry that doesn't meet the requirements of that award. Decisions of the judges are final. Judging will be held at noon on each entry day.

THE STANDARD SYSTEM OF JUDGING AND AWARDING WILL BE USED. A scale of points based on perfection (100 points) is used as follows:

- One First Place — Score 90 or above, Blue Ribbon
- One Second Place — Score 85 or above, Red Ribbon
- One Third Place — Score 80 or above, Yellow Ribbon
- One or more Honorable Mention — scoring 75 or above, White Ribbon

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR ANY TOP EXHIBITOR AWARD, each specimen must score 95 points or higher.

TOP EXHIBITOR AWARDS

- Award of Horticultural Excellence
- Award of Merit
- Grower's Choice Award
- Educational Award
- Award of Design Excellence
- Designer' Choice Award
- Petite Design Award
- Youth Awards by age group

THE SWEEPSTAKES AWARD IS AWARDED PROVIDED TWO (2) OR MORE CLUBS AND/OR ORGANIZATIONS ARE ENTERED IN A SHOW.

The award is given each show to the club or organization with the highest number of points based on:

- 1 point for Horticulture entry
- 3 points for each Petite Design entry
- 3 points for each Artistic Design entry
- 5 points for each 10-Day Feature Artistic entry
- 3 points for each Horticulture Blue Ribbon
- 5 points for each Artistic Blue Ribbon
- 15 points for each Top Award

THE CLUB OR ORGANIZATION COMPETING FOR THE SWEEPSTAKES AWARD MUST make a minimum of seven (7) entries in the Artistic Division, three (3) entries minimum in the Petite Design section and ten (10) entries in the Horticulture section. Each item listed under 10-Day Features shall count as one sweepstakes entry only.

A TYPED OR PRINTED LIST OF CLUB OR ORGANIZATION MEMBERS exhibiting on the day a club or organization is competing for the Sweepstakes Award must be brought to Delta Fair, Wing D(outside entrance) before 9:30 am on the show's first day.

TIES WILL BE BROKEN using the number of red ribbons.

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR ANY TOP EXHIBITOR AWARD, each specimen displayed singly **must score 95 points or higher**.

Entries must be made from 8:00 am-11:00 am on Friday, September 3, 2010. **AT NO OTHER TIME AFTER THE ABOVE DATE WILL "10-DAY FEATURES" BE ACCEPTED.** All "10-Day Features" will be judged prior to the opening of the Fair and will remain on exhibit through Sunday, September 12, 2010.

ADULT SPECIAL EXHIBITS - GS

GS 1 - 4 are Eligible for The Artistic Craft Award of navy ribbons with gold lettering -\$25

Premiums: 1st-\$20 2nd-\$15 3rd-\$10 4th-\$5

- GS 1** **"Delta Dirt"** - Decorate a garden hand tool not to exceed 18". Must include some plant material. Suitable for hanging on a vertical flat surface.
- GS 2** **"You're Gourd-eous"** - Decorate a gourd. To be displayed on a horizontal flat surface.
- GS 3** **"First Class Ticket"** - Decorate a plaque (not to exceed 11" x 14"). Must include a combination of re-cycled objects and dried plant material. Suitable for hanging on a vertical flat surface.
- GS 4** **"A Shoe Not Necessarily Blue"** - Decorate a shoe suitable for displaying on a horizontal flat surface. Must include some plant material.

NO ARTIFICIAL PLANT MATERIAL ALLOWED

ADULT EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS - GS

Eligible for Educational Award of brown and white ribbons -\$25

Limited to one entry in each class. ADVANCE REGISTRATION REQUIRED.

All general educational requirements must be met. Exhibitors must provide cover.

- GS 5** **Gourds -"The Birds"** Educational exhibit staged on a 6' table.
- GS 6** **Moss -"Rolling Stone"** Educational exhibit staged on a 6' table.
- GS 7** **Trees -"Black Oak Arkansas"** Educational exhibit staged on a 6' table.

ONLY ONE EXHIBIT will be allowed in each class per individual. Youth must enter in their own age category. Age MUST be indicated on entry form. Entries will be judged on the standard system of judging.

PLEASE NOTE: POSTER BOARD SIZE MUST BE 11" X 17".

Posters must feature Smokey Bear or Woodsy Owl and must not feature both together. Since Smokey Bear and Woodsy Owl are official icons, protected by Congressional law, the colors of their clothing need to be accurate. Check the colors on the website www.symbols.gov. We are inviting students to demonstrate, through original drawings of Smokey Bear or Woodsy Owl, their understanding of fire prevention and basic environmental conservation principles. 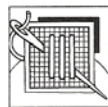

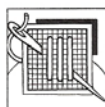

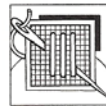
